Katherine Dahlin Remembers:

She married Art in 1933 and came to the Walker area at that time.

There was a fire in 1909. Doesn't know the extent of damage. Stuckey's store (the building) was still here when she came here.

There were working mines all over the place.

She mentioned that Barry Rush (they had cattle) had a team of two big mules and a scraper, and he worked on grading the roads in the area. That was in 1933 – 1935.

They only went to town once a month in those days.

The Snowdrift Mine used to be called the Money Metals Mine.

A mill was located not too far from where the firehouse is now.

In 1939, they lived near the Amulet Mine (now the corner of Walker and Big Bug Mesa Roads.

They bought a cabin for \$15 (12' X 24'), then tore that down and built another house, where the Sunday school was. Then sold to (Dave) Bennett for his mother-in-law. Then Murray bought from Bennett – that's when they got their current property from Bennett.

The orchard on Big Bug used to produce wonderful green apples. We got 16 boxes of apples one time.
